In 2025 let's Pretty Up Kingfisher Park

We all drive past it and walk through it often – and our gorgeous park is in need of some TLC.

Yes, it's got fitness equipment and a couple of play areas, but there's lots of room for improvement.

Long term, our Parent Committee are working on plans for a nature play area. Short term, we're wanting to add some colour and some structure to the open sandy areas. We're also applying for grants to upgrade the basketball court and skate park. Watch this space... we'll keep you posted.

The plan

Julie Dols, through Men of the Trees (Peel Branch) has ordered nearly 400 plants to be delivered at the beginning of Autumn. Most of these are shrubs and ground covers to fill in the sandy spaces under the existing trees.

We'll be working with the council to identify prime planting areas, ensuring that the council mowing contractors are aware of the new plantings.

Mulching

We'll be approaching the Shire of Murray to assist with truckloads of mulch to cover the areas under the trees and the sandy corner along Kingfisher.

Mulching day: May 4 (Sunday) @10am

Please come along and help spread mulch. If you have a bobcat that we could borrow or you could operate, it will make the work much lighter. Bring your garden forks, spades, rakes and a wheelbarrow if you have one.
